

## Grade 9 Supply Lists

All incoming Grade 9 students will take foundational, year-long courses in English, history, and science, and supplies in the math department are the same regardless of level. Supply lists for those courses are collected here for Grade 9 students and families. They're also included later in the document on their respective department pages. **Language courses vary, so families should also find the appropriate supply list for their child's language of study in this document.**

### English 9

- Notebook for journaling and in-class writing
- Folder or binder to keep handouts and drafts
- Pens/pencils/highlighters
- Post-it notes or note cards for annotation/note-taking
- 1 box of tissues

### Environmental Science Supply List

- 1 box of tissues
- 3-ring, 1-subject binder with lined paper
- Clipboard
- Pencil case with:
  - highlighter; scissors; glue stick; pencil and eraser; blue, black, and red pen; colored pencils; metric ruler; calculator (can use the calculator required for math class)
- Optional: personal laptop is not required but highly recommended

- One 3-inch, 3-ring binder

- 3-hole-punched folder
- Pencils, preferably pre-sharpened or mechanical
- Dry erase markers
- 1 box of tissues
- Access to a web-capable device like a laptop, tablet, or Chromebook is preferred

#### **Physics Supply List**

- Pencils
- 1-inch binder for class notes
- Scientific or graphing calculator
